

The Christmas Story From the Book of Mormon

The words of Luke ring like the voice of an old friend—familiar and reassuring: “Firstborn son ... in a manger ... shepherds abiding in the field ... glory to God in the highest.” They are words so familiar we can almost quote them at will from memory.

But what of the words of Nephi? He saw in vision the birth of the Savior 600 years before it happened. What of Samuel the Lamanite’s brave prophecy? Against the arrows of the wicked, he foretold the coming light. What of the stirring account in Third Nephi?
